THREE MONTHS OF IMPACT: NACP'S COLLECTIVE ACHIEVEMENTS

The North America Civic Platform (NACP) is a loose umbrella organization that connects highlights the inspiring work of Hizmet-inspired institutions and initiatives across the United States and Canada. It is described as "loose" because while each affiliate operates independently with its own programs and leadership, they are united by shared Hizmet values of service, dialogue, and community building. Between July and September 2025 alone, these affiliates organized more than 300 events and activities, reaching tens of thousands of people from diverse backgrounds. These included milestone gatherings such as the Peace Festival 2025 in New Jersey with 24 partner organizations, the SDGs Conference at the United Nations with 56 global partners, humanitarian missions by the Dallas Aidventurers Youth Group in Uganda, record-breaking community potlucks in California, educational and programs mentorship seminars to interfaith dialogues across North America. Each initiative reflected NACP's mission to build bridges of peace, strengthen civic values, and promote service to humanity.

Beyond events, NACP's measurable impact during this quarter underscores its role as a major Hizmet organization in North America. Affiliates helped equip over 4,290 students across 10 states with school supplies, provided humanitarian aid to 430 flood-affected families in Texas, supported 42,000 cataract surgeries worldwide, and enabled clean water access for more than 1.1 million people. By combining cultural programs, youth mentorship, interfaith dialogue, and direct humanitarian relief, **NACP** demonstrates how service (hizmet) strengthens communities at home while extending compassion abroad. Its collective achievements embody the belief that sustainable change begins action rooted grassroots empathy, education, and cooperation.

Atilla Kahveci, Pacifica's President, emphasized this was only the beginning of a growing tradition.

Guests enjoyed live music, dance, and the Best Dish Contest, celebrating food as a bridge across cultures. The gathering showed the power of hospitality and human connection, where strangers became friends and unity flourished in Orange County.

Speaking on behalf of the organization, Aslihan Kas, Director and Silent Screams Exhibition Coordinator, reminded participants that "behind every number is a person, and behind every statistic a story that must be heard." She highlighted the devastating effects of legal harassment, defamation, and restrictions on families — from children facing detention to tragic deaths in custody and along migration routes.

Ms. Kas urged a rights-based, survivor-centered response, calling for the protection of due process, child-sensitive justice, safe civic space, and expanded psychosocial and legal services. Concluding with a vision of renewal, she affirmed that, despite adversity, civil society will continue to advance justice, freedom, and equality.



DALLAS AIDVENTURERS YOUTH GROUP BRINGS MEANINGFUL AID TO UGANDA

Meaningful Humanitarian Visit: Dallas Aidventurers Youth Group in Uganda

From July 3 to 15, 2025, the Aidventurers Youth Group—affiliated with the Raindrop Cultural Center in Texas—embarked on a humanitarian mission to Uganda under the theme "Ubuntu," meaning "I exist because we are."

They carried out six aid projects aligned with the UN's Sustainable Development Goals across four areas: social support, health, education, and economic empowerment.

- Clean Water: Wells were drilled in the villages of Lukolo, Kyuka, and Nakulyaku, providing safe drinking water to 1,500 people and protecting them from waterborne illnesses such as typhoid and cholera.
- Orphanage Support: In Jinja's Wampa Orphanage, about 300 children received meals, funded through donations raised by the youth group.
- Cataract Surgeries: Volunteers helped local doctors at Nil Hospital conduct cataract surgeries for 20 individuals, restoring their vision and improving quality of life.
- Economic Empowerment: Twenty vocational students were provided with sewing machines to help them start their own businesses. In addition, 20 families received bicycles and another 20 families were given goats to support transportation, income generation, and sustainable living.

This initiative not only addressed urgent needs but also created lasting opportunities, reflecting the spirit of solidarity and shared humanity.

From August 15–17, 2025, mentors from North Carolina gathered in Virginia for the Mid-Atlantic Mentor Seminar Program. The three-day event featured workshops, seminars, and consultations focused on strengthening mentorship skills and building new approaches to guide students.

TEXAS FLOOD RELIEF BY EMBRACE RELIEF

Embrace Relief and our partners at the Raindrop Foundation of San Antonio are working closely with local authorities to provide urgent assistance to victims of the devastating floods that struck central Texas on Friday, July

WHAT HAPPENED?

More than 110 people — including more than 30 children — have lost their lives following torrential rains that caused once—in—a—century flooding in Kerr, Burnet and Travis counties, located to the north and west of San Antonio and Austin. The storms, which struck the region early Friday morning, dropped as much as 6 inches of rain in a matter of hours, overwhelming roads, riverbanks, and residential neighborhoods with little warning. The region continues to be at risk of more flooding from continued rain, hampering search—and-rescue and rebuilding efforts.

While the full extent of the damage is still being assessed, it is clear that communities in the affected area will face a long, painful recovery as the floodwaters recede. It is also clear that the need for immediate support is substantial.
