SERVING COMMUNITIES, BUILDING BRIDGES: NACP 2025 OVERVIEW

2025

Throughout 2025, organizations affiliated with the **North America Civic Platform** (NACP) continued to exemplify the core values of the **Hizmet Movement** across the United States: service to humanity, dialogue, education, compassion, and civic engagement. Inspired by a deep sense of social responsibility, volunteers, educators, youth, and community leaders worked tirelessly to respond to local needs while strengthening bonds among diverse communities.

From large-scale humanitarian relief efforts to interfaith dialogue programs, educational initiatives, youth leadership development, cultural festivals, and advocacy for human rights, 2025 stood out as a year of **measurable impact and collective action**. NACP-affiliated organizations partnered with hundreds of local institutions, public officials, schools, faith communities, and civil society actors, demonstrating that collaboration rooted in empathy can create lasting change.

Across the country, **over 700 events and activities** were organized in dozens of states, **reaching more than 100,000 participants** in person. Through coordinated food drives, disaster relief operations, and social support programs, **over 588,000 people received food, meat, or hot meals**, while **1.1 million people gained access to clean water** through international humanitarian efforts. Educational equity remained a priority, with **4,290+ underprivileged students receiving** school-supply backpacks, and **10,000+ students supported** through academic, mentoring, and youth empowerment programs.

2025: A YEAR OF SERVICE, DIALOGUE, AND SHARED HUMANITY

Health and human dignity were central to Hizmet-inspired service in 2025. 5,364+ individuals received cataract surgeries and health screenings, restoring sight and improving quality of life. In times of crisis, such as the Texas floods, 1,400+ disaster victims were supported through emergency aid and recovery assistance. Meanwhile, advocacy initiatives and international platforms amplified the voices of the silenced, reminding the world that behind every statistic is a human story.

Dialogue and education continued to shape public life through **10+ conferences, 25+ workshops**, university panels, UN-level forums, and interfaith gatherings. These efforts fostered understanding across faiths, cultures, and generations, while also engaging policymakers, academics, journalists, and youth leaders. The impact extended far beyond physical spaces, with **over 2 million social media views and 85+ shares by local media outlets**, prominent figures, and institutions, helping positive stories reach a wider audience.

Recognition followed service. In 2025, **19 awards honored** the dedication of Hizmet-inspired individuals and organizations, affirming the value of volunteerism, ethical leadership, and community-centered action. **Supported by 500+ partner organizations**, NACP-affiliated initiatives showed that sustainable change is possible when people act together for the common good.

This summary reflects not only numbers, but a living story of hope, resilience, and shared humanity. The events of 2025 stand as a testament to what can be achieved when service is guided by conscience, dialogue is rooted in respect, and communities come together to uplift one another across the United States and beyond. ♦

Thanksgiving Aid Reaches 1,625 Families Nationwide

As Thanksgiving approached, volunteers inspired by the Hizmet Movement joined hands with Embrace Relief's national coordination team, American partner organizations, and community leaders to launch a large-scale humanitarian effort across nine states. Through 17 separate events, 1,625 families received hot meals, turkeys, and essential food packages.

This comprehensive initiative reached communities in Texas, Georgia, Virginia, North Carolina, Illinois, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and Rhode Island. Volunteers prepared and delivered 670 food packages and 955 turkey or protein boxes, ensuring families could celebrate the holiday with a full and festive table.

The effort reflected the spirit of service and solidarity that defines the Thanksgiving season, showing what is possible when volunteers, local institutions, and community partners unite for the common good.

1,625 families received hot meals, turkeys, and essential food packages.

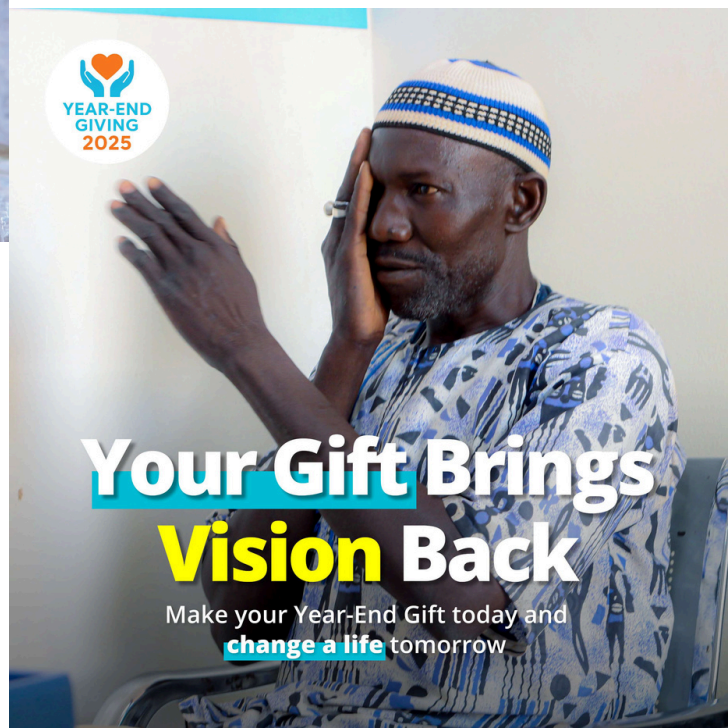

TEXAS FLOOD RELIEF BY EMBRACE RELIEF

ORGANIZERS

Embrace Relief and our partners at the Raindrop Foundation of San Antonio are working closely with local authorities to provide urgent assistance to victims of the devastating floods that struck central Texas on Friday, July

WHAT HAPPENED?

More than 110 people -- including more than 30 children -- have lost their lives following torrential rains that caused once-in-a-century flooding in Kerr, Burnet and Travis counties, located to the north and west of San Antonio and Austin. The storms, which struck the region early Friday morning, dropped as much as 6 inches of rain in a matter of hours, overwhelming roads, riverbanks, and residential neighborhoods with little warning. The region continues to be at risk of more flooding from continued rain, hampering search-and-rescue and rebuilding efforts.

While the full extent of the damage is still being assessed, it is clear that communities in the affected area will face a long, painful recovery as the floodwaters recede. It is also clear that the need for immediate support is substantial.

EMBRACE RELIEF SUPPORTS 4,290 STUDENTS WITH SCHOOL SUPPLIES ACROSS 10 STATES

As the new school year begins, millions of U.S. students from low-income families struggle to access basic supplies. To address this challenge, Embrace Relief launched a school supply distribution for the 2025–2026 academic year.

In partnership with local schools, community organizations, and officials, the charity reached 4,290 students across 10 states (NJ, NY, VA, TX, IL, NC, RI, PA, MD, GA). Backpacks and supplies helped children start school on equal footing, motivated and ready to learn.

Embrace Relief emphasized that supporting education is investing in a brighter future and pledged to continue such initiatives.

DALLAS AIDVENTURERS YOUTH GROUP BRINGS MEANINGFUL AID TO UGANDA

Meaningful Humanitarian Visit: Dallas Aidventurers Youth Group in Uganda

From July 3 to 15, 2025, the Aidventurers Youth Group—affiliated with the Raindrop Cultural Center in Texas—embarked on a humanitarian mission to Uganda under the theme “Ubuntu,” meaning “I exist because we are.”

They carried out six aid projects aligned with the UN’s Sustainable Development Goals across four areas: social support, health, education, and economic empowerment.

- **Clean Water:** Wells were drilled in the villages of Lukolo, Kyuka, and Nakulyaku, providing safe drinking water to 1,500 people and protecting them from waterborne illnesses such as typhoid and cholera.
- **Orphanage Support:** In Jinja’s Wampa Orphanage, about 300 children received meals, funded through donations raised by the youth group.
- **Cataract Surgeries:** Volunteers helped local doctors at Nil Hospital conduct cataract surgeries for 20 individuals, restoring their vision and improving quality of life.
- **Economic Empowerment:** Twenty vocational students were provided with sewing machines to help them start their own businesses. In addition, 20 families received bicycles and another 20 families were given goats to support transportation, income generation, and sustainable living.

This initiative not only addressed urgent needs but also created lasting opportunities, reflecting the spirit of solidarity and shared humanity.





Global Visionary Award Presented to Raindrop Foundation at UN Houston Gala

The Raindrop Foundation was honored with the Global Visionary Award at the 2025 United Nations Day Gala, held at the Junior League of Houston. 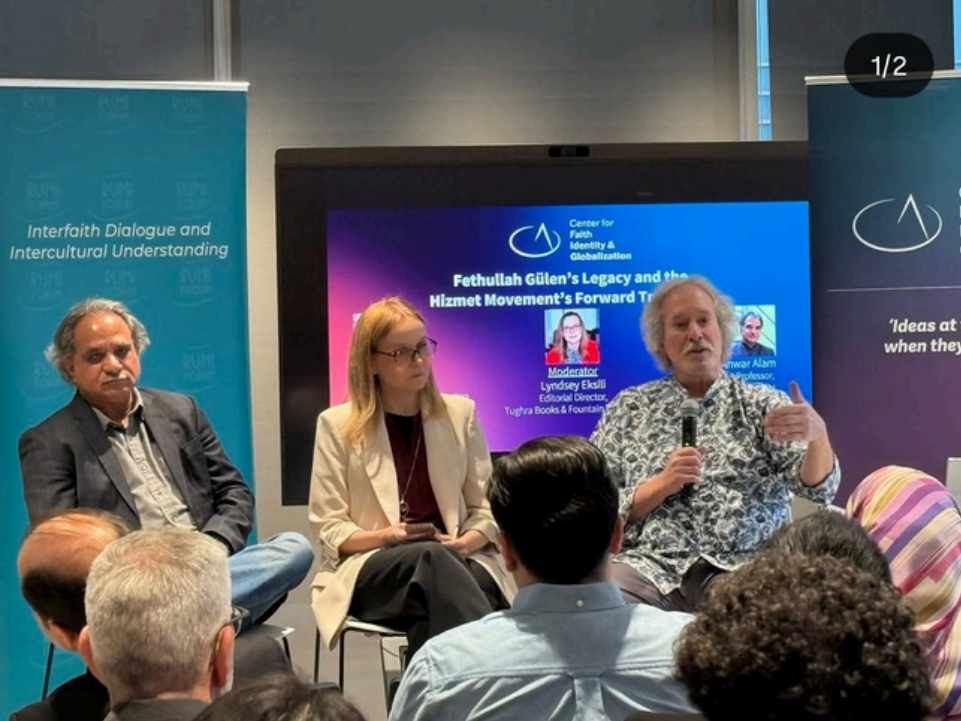

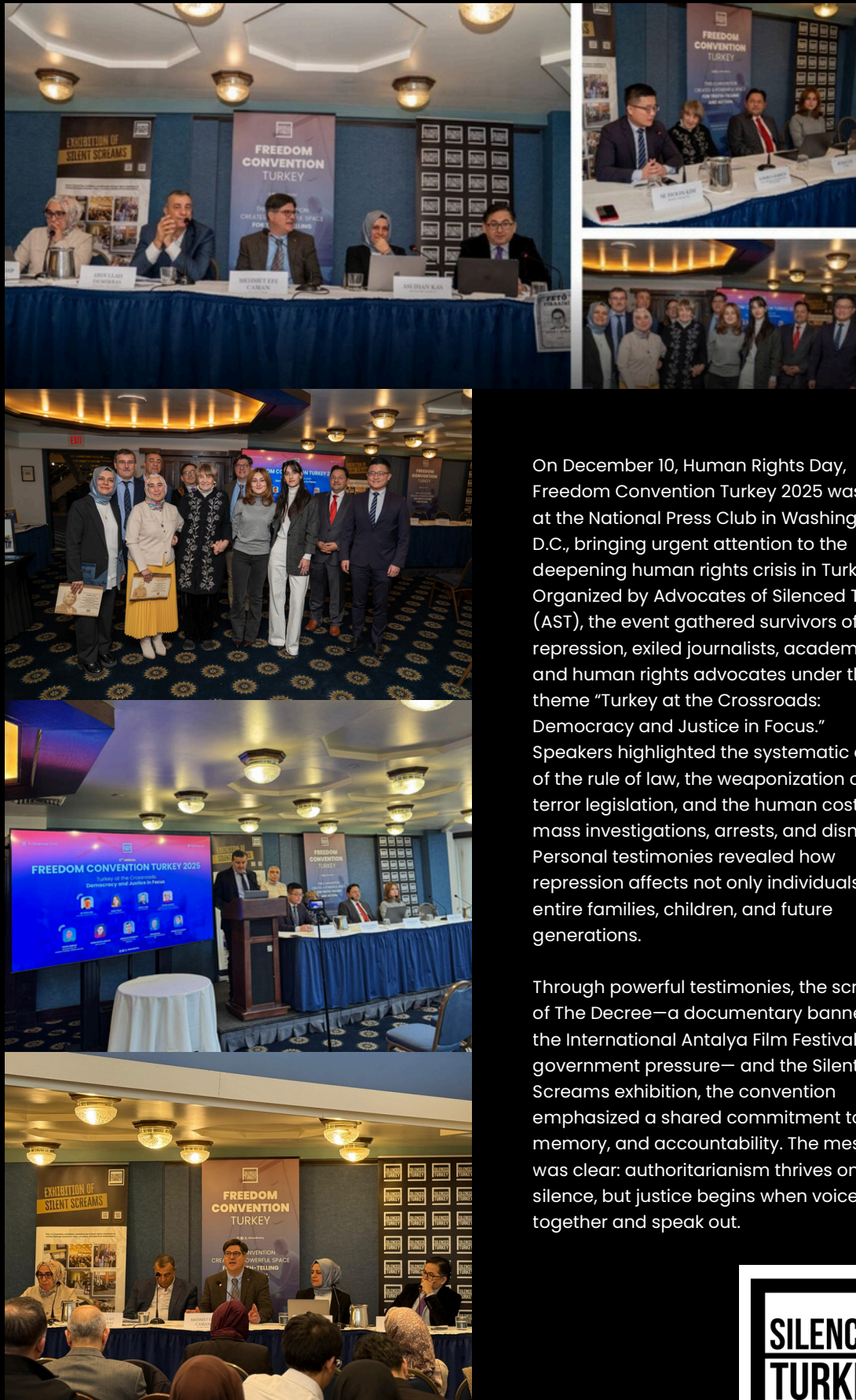

FREEDOM CONVENTION TURKEY 2025



On December 10, Human Rights Day, Freedom Convention Turkey 2025 was held at the National Press Club in Washington, D.C., bringing urgent attention to the deepening human rights crisis in Turkey. Organized by Advocates of Silenced Turkey (AST), the event gathered survivors of repression, exiled journalists, academics, and human rights advocates under the theme "Turkey at the Crossroads: Democracy and Justice in Focus."

Speakers highlighted the systematic erosion of the rule of law, the weaponization of anti-terror legislation, and the human cost of mass investigations, arrests, and dismissals. Personal testimonies revealed how repression affects not only individuals but entire families, children, and future generations.

Through powerful testimonies, the screening of *The Decree*—a documentary banned from the International Antalya Film Festival under government pressure— and the *Silent Screams* exhibition, the convention emphasized a shared commitment to truth, memory, and accountability. The message was clear: authoritarianism thrives on silence, but justice begins when voices come together and speak out.

METAMORPHOSIS SHINES AT BIG APPLE FILM FESTIVAL

After winning six international awards and two official selections, the documentary *Metamorphosis* has now been selected for the prestigious Big Apple Film Festival, where it screened before the jury last night. Directed by a woman who fled her country after severe human rights violations, the film honors the strength of four courageous women—İşık, Ayşegül, Hacer, and Kurdish writer Meral Şimşek—whose stories of torture, separation, and mistreatment form its powerful core. By keeping their experiences alive, *Metamorphosis* aims to ensure their suffering is never forgotten. The director thanked the women who supported her journey and expressed gratitude to the Big Apple Film Festival team for their warm welcome.



At the #UNGA80 SDGs Conference 2025, Advocates of Silenced Turkey amplified the voices of those suffering under repression during Panel 3: Cross-Cutting Threats to the Principles of Democracy.

Speaking on behalf of the organization, Aslihan Kas, Director and Silent Screams Exhibition Coordinator, reminded participants that “behind every number is a person, and behind every statistic a story that must be heard.” She highlighted the devastating effects of legal harassment, defamation, and restrictions on families — from children facing detention to tragic deaths in custody and along migration routes.

Ms. Kas urged a rights-based, survivor-centered response, calling for the protection of due process, child-sensitive justice, safe civic space, and expanded psychosocial and legal services. Concluding with a vision of renewal, she affirmed that, despite adversity, civil society will continue to advance justice, freedom, and equality.

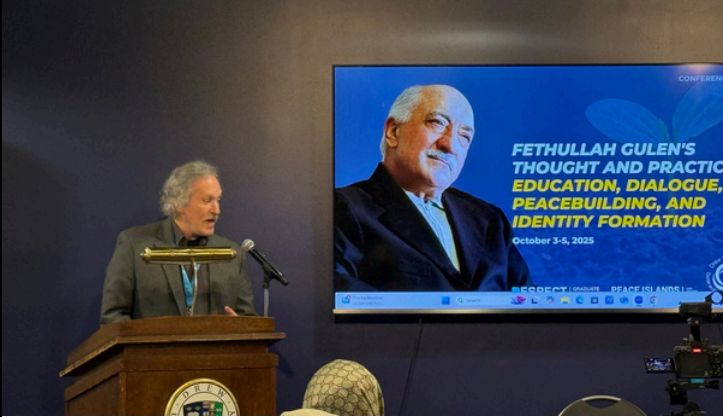

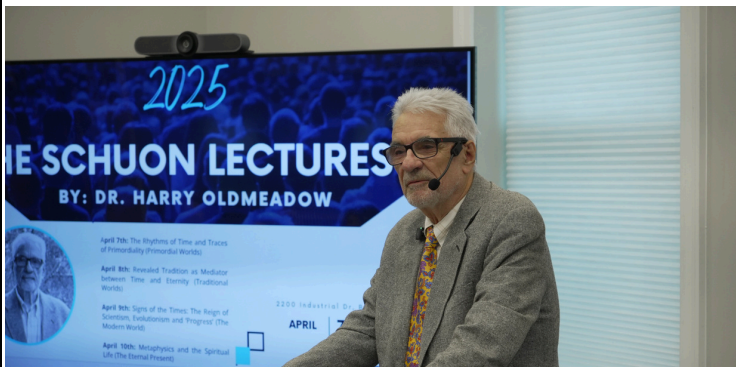

UN Youth Forum Panel – Youth Voices for Access to Quality Education, Social Inclusion, and Sustainable Development



At a panel held during the UN Youth Forum, Maria Guardado, a delegate of Canada's NATO Youth Club; Marina El-Khawand, founder of the Lebanon-based Medonations platform; Lyzianah Emakoua, President of the Community Engagement Center from Sierra Leone; and Leyla Y., President of Columbia University's Blossom Together Club, shared their successful projects on sustainable development and social inclusion. The panelists emphasized the need to elevate young people's voices as equal stakeholders in decision-making processes. The session also highlighted humanitarian projects led by the Blossom Together community in Benin, Mali, Tanzania, Burkina Faso, and Guinea.

Fostering Unity and Interfaith Dialogue through Digital Stories

Every February, during the UN World Interfaith Harmony Week, the Journalists and Writers Foundation (JWF/GYV) organized events under the theme “Becoming Human Again: Hope for Reconciliation,” emphasizing the importance of interfaith dialogue and coexistence for sustainable peace. Religious leaders from Muslim, Hindu, and Jewish communities across the United States, South Africa, Italy, Argentina, and India highlighted the need to unite around shared human values amid rising social tensions.

The program also featured the panel “Interfaith Voices for Peace and Justice,” where young professionals from Kenya, Nigeria, and the U.S. shared successful interfaith civil society initiatives. In addition, JWF/GYV’s “Global Youth Voices” video campaign amplified inclusive peace messages from young people in 12 countries through its social media platforms.

United Nations Commission on the Status of Women Sessions



In 2025, during the 69th session of the UN Commission on the Status of Women, GYV/JWF organized 14 panels in New York with 16 global partners from seven countries. Over two weeks, 78 speakers from 21 countries discussed women’s roles in sustainable peace and security, the contributions of refugee women, young women’s leadership in democratization, and violence against women journalists. A highlighted GYV session focused on challenges faced by women civil society leaders, where Center for New Americans volunteer Havvanur Özdemir addressed human rights violations in Türkiye and shared success stories of refugee women. The program also included a Ramadan Reception that brought together international experts and UN diplomats.

The 6th annual Media and Journalism Webinars brought together 44 young journalists and media professionals from 29 countries. Through five online sessions, hands-on workshops, seminars, and mentoring with professional journalists, the certificate program focused on practical learning and addressed key UN-prioritized topics such as ethical investigative journalism, media literacy in the age of disinformation, journalism and human rights advocacy, and digital violence and censorship.
